Important Notice Concerning Public Hearing on NBCUA Connection Fees

The Northwest Bergen County Utilities Authority (the "Authority") will conduct a Public Hearing on May 17, 2022 at 7:00p.m., regarding the calculation of connection fees for the calendar year 2022 pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:14B-22 and N.J.S.A. 40:14B-23.


The monies recovered from the connections fees will assist the Authority in minimizing future rate increases to its member municipalities and direct ratepayers. The proposed connection fee requires new connectors to pay their "fair share" of the costs of the existing NBCUA system that has been paid to date by current ratepayers and direct customers of the NBCUA. The Commissioners of the Authority will establish the 2022 connection fee rate at the time of the Public Hearing.

In accordance with the program the NBCUA will annually refund your municipality 15%, up to a \$10,000 maximum per connection, of every new connection fee collected from your municipality.

Please take Notice that the Northwest Bergen County Utilities Authority (the “Authority”) with offices located at 30 Wyckoff Avenue, Waldwick, New Jersey, will conduct a Public Hearing regarding the calculation of a connection fee for the calendar year 2022 pursuant to N.J.S.A.40:14B-22 and N.J.S.A.40:14B-23 on Tuesday, May 17, 2022 immediately following the Work Session at 7:00pm. During the Public Hearing, members of the public may provide comments to the Authority and ask questions regarding the calculation of the connection fee for calendar year 2022.

The report of Wielkocz & Company, LLC, the auditors for the Authority, which will form the basis for the calculation of the connection fee for the calendar year 2022, will be posted to the Authority’s website, nbcua.com, for public inspection beginning May 2, 2022.

Subject: 2023 Services Charges - Water Usage and EDU data—Due June 27, 2022

Dear Mayor and Council Members:

The Authority is requesting water usage and EDU data before Monday, June 27, 2022, so that the information can be reviewed and any problems can be resolved during July when our consultant reviews the data. Please provide this letter to the person responsible for providing this information and have them complete the attached forms (or utilize your equivalents) and return them to the Authority. If you cannot provide this information by June 27, please let us know as soon as possible so that we can re-schedule the review by our consultant.

The Authority will be using this information to prepare your Service Charges, which are proportioned among the user communities. The method for determining the Service Charges for each municipality is based on a formula that proportions the Service Charge distribution among the municipalities based on the following:

- 60% Metered Sewage Flow
- 20% Water Usage (Winter Quarters)
- 20% Equivalent Dwelling Units - EDUs

Water consumption data for the last quarter of 2021 and the first quarter of 2022 should be totaled and reported on the attached form entitled "Water Consumption Summary Data." The water consumption should be only the water used by sanitary sewer users. Water consumption should be the sum of all residential and non-residential billing water meters plus the water consumption for residents and non-residents using private wells and municipal sewers. Using a sample group of meters and then estimating water usage based on the sample is not acceptable. If a water meter is not operational or inaccurate, you should estimate the water usage based on historical information. To assist you, we have entered the consumption data reported last year. If your values have changed more than ± 15% from last year, please provide a brief explanation for the change. We have also indicated on this form the total number of water connections reported on the Monthly Sewer User Report for October 2021. Please report all data requested on the form. If there are Authority facilities in your municipality, the water usage for these facilities should be reported in the "water sold to other" section and not in the "water sources" section.

To calculate the non-residential EDUs, the form "Non-Residential Equivalent Dwelling Units" should be used. Using this form, or its equivalent, each municipality will list all of its non-residential sanitary sewer system users and their water usage for the last quarter of 2021 and the first quarter of 2022. If a water meter is not operational or inaccurate, you should estimate the water usage based on historical information. The EDUs for the non-residential users should be calculated as indicated on the form. Please remember to carefully review your municipality's list of non-residential sewer and water users from last year and to update the list to reflect all the accounts that have been added or removed since last year. This year we will again use 170 gallons per day (gpd) in the EDU calculations. If your total non-residential water use has changed more than $\pm 15\%$ from last year, please provide a brief explanation for the change. Municipalities should report the following four water usage categories:

- 4th quarter residential water use
- 4th quarter non-residential water use
- 1st quarter residential water use
- 1st quarter non-residential water use


You must include all connections and water usage from the sewers in municipalities adjacent to yours and drain through your municipality's sewer system. This means that you need to supply the Authority with connection and water usage data, including non-residential EDU data for the sanitary sewer systems, which your system serves through inter-municipal service agreements. We request that you report these connections separately as well as in the total. If your municipality contains Authority facilities, do not include them in the Non-Residential Equivalent Dwelling Units calculation. Please have the water system manager review the information before them sending to the Authority.

The number of residential units reported on the Monthly Sewer Connections Report is also needed since this number is necessary to calculate the total number of EDUs. Therefore, it is essential that the report for October 2022 be submitted promptly to the Authority.

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 4 OF THE CODE OF THE
BOROUGH OF RAMSEY, BERGEN COUNTY, NEW JERSEY
AND MORE SPECIFICALLY SECTION 4-13.10 ENTITLED
TOWING AND STORAGE FEE SCHEDULE**

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Ramsey, Bergen County, New Jersey that Chapter 4 of the Borough Code and more specifically Section 4-13.10 entitled Towing and Storage Fee Schedule be and hereby is amended as follows:

SECTION 1. 4-13.10

b. The following is a fee schedule for basic automobiles, motorcycles and motorized bike towing services and heavy-duty recovery.

1. Road Service.

- (a) Cars (Light): \$135.00 per hour plus parts
- (b) Trucks (Medium/Heavy): \$185.00 per hour plus parts

2. Towing – Basic.

- (a) Light Duty up to 10,000 lbs.: Hook-up \$175.00
- (b) Medium Duty 10,001 to 16,000 lbs.: \$260.00 per hour
- (c) Heavy Duty 16,001 and above: \$550.00 per hour
- (d) Motorcycle: \$225 Hook-up
- (e) Decoupling fee (if tow is not performed): ½ of basic rate

3. On-Hook Mileage.

- (a) Light Duty up to 10,000 lbs.: \$7.25 per loaded miles
- (b) Medium Duty 10,001 to 16,000 lbs.: \$7.25 per loaded miles
- (c) Heavy Duty 16,001 and above: \$7.25 per loaded miles

4. Recovery/Winching (In Addition to Towing-per truck including driver).

- (a) Light Duty up to 10,000 lbs.: \$200.00 per hour charged in ½ hour increments of \$100.00 per ½ hour
- (b) Medium Duty 10,001 to 16,000 lbs.: \$360.00 per hour charged in ½ hour increments of \$180.00 per ½ hour
- (b) Heavy Duty 16,001 and above: \$625.00 per hour
- (c) Basic Winching of passenger vehicles due to flat tire or unable to roll billed at \$100.00

5. Specialized Recovery Equipment.

- (a) Rotator/Crane Recovery Unit: \$1,300.00 per hour (minimum 4 hours billed)
- (b) Air Cushion Unit: \$1,300.00 per hour
- (c) Any other specialized equipment: \$300.00 per hour

6. Storage-Per Calendar Day (Inside Rates Two Times Outside Rate).

- (a) Cars/Light Trucks 10' X 20' space: \$65.00 per day
- (b) Trucks (Dual wheels)/Single Axle: \$100.00 per day
- (c) Tractor/Dump Truck//Trailers: \$150.00 per unit per day
- (d) Tractor and Trailer Combo: \$250.00 per day
- (e) Buses: \$150.00 per day
- (f) Roll-Off: \$150.00 per day for each
- (g) Cargo/Accident Debris/Load Storage/Vehicle Components 10' X 20 Space \$55.00 per space used per day
- (h) Rental of Any Tow Company Supplied Trailer Post Incident \$500.00 per day

7. Additional Services/Notes.

- (a) Fuel/Haz-Mat/Cargo Spills Clean-Up and Disposal: Time and Material
- (b) Haz-Mat and Trash Recovery: Surcharged 10%
- (c) Subcontractor Mark-Up: \$10%
- (d) Administrative Charge Only After 3rd Visit to Vehicle: Cars only \$50.00
- (e) Administrative Charge: Medium/Heavy Truck \$200.00
- (f) After Hours Release: \$75.00
- (g) Notification Documentation Fee: \$50.00
- (h) Tarping/Wrapping Vehicle: \$100.00 per Car \$260.00 per Truck
- (i) Fuel Surcharge: Reserved for Future Need

C. Heavy-vehicle recovery (Over 16,000 pounds):

1. To provide heavy-vehicle recovery, the Borough of Ramsey requires that the licensee have on scene a recovery supervisor with Level 3 certification from the Towing and Recovery Association of America (TRAA) or another nationally recognized certification. The certificate is to be included with the initial application.

- 2. To perform heavy-vehicle recovery under this section the licensee must:
 - (a) Visually document the recovery scene through photos or videotape.
 - (b) Prepare a written report of all procedures employed, actions taken, equipment used and manpower requirements to complete the recovery process in the safest manner and provide a copy to the vehicle owner with the statement of services.
 - (c) Prepare an itemized billing invoice for all services rendered.

3. If the licensee finds it necessary, due to the manner of the recovery to contract additional recovery service to supplement its equipment and manpower recovery, the contracted service providers must work under the supervision of the licensee. The licensee may not subcontract the entire recovery. In the event that a heavy-duty operator is unable to handle the recovery, then the next heavy-duty wrecker on the rotating list shall be called.

SECTION 2. Repealer.

All Ordinances or parts of Ordinance inconsistent or in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed as to said inconsistencies and conflicts.

SECTION 3. Severability.

If the provisions of any section, part of any section, or clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional, said decision shall not affect the remaining provisions of this Ordinance. The Governing Body of the Borough of Ramsey declares that it would have passed the Ordinance and each section and subsection thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more of the subsections, sentences, clauses or phrases may be declared unconstitutional or invalid

SECTION 4. Effective Date

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon passage and publication as required by law.
