3. Announcements: Mrs. Waring said that the latest CPR class that was held in April had over 50 attendees of all ages. The class was held from 1-21 There are 2 more classes coming up. One from 6-7 and one from 7:30-8:30.

The salon owners in Ridgewood are protesting their annual license fees. 137 deer were killed by bow and arrow in Saddle River. Dr. Tartini had a letter to the editor in the Bergen Record printed on Feb. 17th. It involved ticks and deer. There are going to be many more ticks following our wet winter. Dr. Tartini's lecture is in April. Mrs. Waring has been collecting articles for the Ramsey newsletter about the anti-vaccinators.
