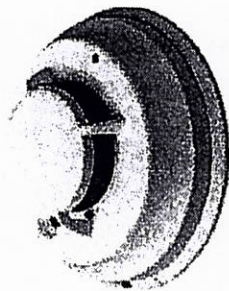


Smoke Detector Disposal

Handling Smoke Detectors



Although it is legal in New Jersey to dispose of the ionization detector in the trash, you are encouraged to return the detector back to the manufacturer. Detect returned radioactive detectors for disposal. They are mandated by the Nuclear Regulatory law 10 CFR 32.27 to see that the radioactive waste is disposed properly. When sending back a smoke detector, do not take it apart. The batteries should be removed and properly disposed of or recycled as appropriate. No special smoke detector, just wrap it in padding, place it in a box, and send it.

Homeowners can mail smoke detectors back to the appropriate manufacturer ONLY. All alarms/detectors are to be marked "For Disposal."
